**Introduction**

At Hallgate Primary School, we choose to have a school uniform as it contributes to our ethos and culture, sets the tone for promoting good behaviour, and fosters a strong sense of community. Pupils at Hallgate wear the uniform with pride.

We have the highest expectations from our pupils with regard to school uniform and appearance and strongly believe that our high standards promote positive behaviour, support effective teaching and learning and contribute positively to the overall ethos of our school.

**School Uniform**

All children are expected to wear a school uniform that aligns with this policy. There are some cases, however, when reasonable adjustments will be made in agreement with school staff / the Headteacher.

**Pre-School (Foundation Stage 1)**

Uniform for preschool children is optional. However, a blue sweatshirt with the school logo is available for purchase from Price and Buckland; a link can be found on the school website. Plain blue polo shirts are also worn in preschool. Children in preschool do not need a PE kit in school.

**EYFS to Year 6**

- White shirt or polo shirt
  - Bottle green jumper or cardigan
  - Tie (bottle green and silver, wide stripe) (an elastic tie is available for children in EYFS and KS1) [optional]
  - Grey skirt / grey trousers / grey shorts
  - Black shoes or black trainers (trainers must be plain black, coloured logos or features are not permitted).
  - Bottle green check dress / playsuit

- For PE: House t-shirt (see below), navy or black shorts, trainers. Black or Blue sweatshirt and tracksuit bottoms for outdoor PE in autumn and spring terms

Parents will be notified of PE days and children will come into school in their PE kit on these days.

Children without a PE kit will not be able to participate, for health and safety reasons, and parents will be contacted by school staff, if that is the case.

#### Jewellery and Hair

Children are not permitted to wear jewellery in school, other than stud earrings and a watch. This is for health and safety reasons. If your child wears an item of jewellery for religious or personal reasons, please speak to the school office to seek permission for this. Long hair should be tied back.

Children are not permitted to wear make-up during the school day for any reason. The wearing of nail varnish is discouraged and parents are asked to remove nail varnish as soon as practical, if their child has had painted nails for a special occasion.

#### Labelling

**Please ensure that all items of clothing that are brought into school are clearly / permanently labelled and that your child knows where to look for his/her name.**

A lost property trolley is in the entrance from the KS1 playground, near the school office.

**School staff are not responsible for looking for lost items.**

#### Uniform Purchasing

The following items can be purchased from Price and Buckland:

Jumpers, cardigans, ties, PE t-shirts, waterproof coats, book bags, knitted hats and caps.

These are all available from Price and Buckland, a link to which can be found on the school website. Items can be delivered to school for collection, free of charge.

#### Non-Compliance

All staff will monitor adherence to our Uniform Policy and class teachers will, in the first instance, alert parents to issues / concerns. Further breaches of school policy will be addressed by the Headteacher or a member of the Senior Leadership Team.



### Monitoring

The governing board monitors and reviews the Uniform Policy regularly, by seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy.

A review of the policy and further amendment took place in June 2025, in line with implementation of OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning); OPAL guidance has influenced the updates to our policy, as we move towards a more 'active uniform'. An active uniform is suitable for a child's daily activities, allowing them to be comfortable, move freely, and play safely—even during more adventurous outdoor play.

The most recent review took place in June 2025.
