

Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter - Autumn Term 2026

What will we be learning?

English	In English we are focusing on the text, a river. We are going to learn how to use a range of conjunctions and descriptive language including expanded noun phrases.
Maths	In Maths, we are going to be focusing on place value. We are going to learn how to count to 100 by recognising tens and ones. We will learn to partition numbers and place them on a number line.
Science	In Science we will be learning about Animals (including Humans). We will be identifying their features, what groups they are in and what they eat.
History	In History, we are going to learn about who Guy Fawkes was and why the gunpowder plot was created. We are going to experience bonfire night and learn about different ways it is celebrated.
Art	In art we will be drawing portraits, and we will be looking at picasso for inspiration. We will be using a variety of tools including pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt-tips, charcoal pens and chalk.
Computing and Online Safety	In Computing we are going to learn how to type on a Chromebook. We are going to learn how to delete and edit text. In Online Safety, we are going to learn how to keep personal information private and safe.
Music	This half term, we are exploring call and response, our theme for this half term is animals.
Religious Education	This half term we will be exploring: What do some people believe God looks like?
Personal Development	This half term we will be learning about 'Being Me in my World', we will be having conversations about our new class and how we can we feel special and safe. We will discuss our rights and responsibilities, as well as rewards and consequences.
Physical Education	We will be having Hull FC leading our PE lessons this half-term, we will be doing athletics and invasion games.
